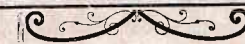

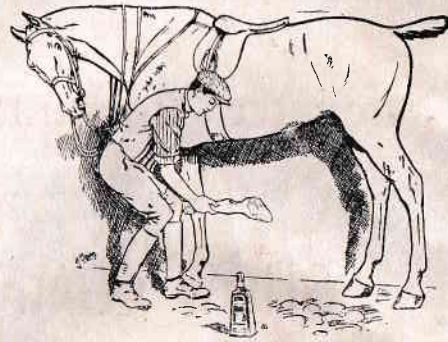

It is the retreat, and when the last grumble of the drums has died away in the distance, mothers are calling in the children, and the men are lighting up their big pipes, and the music of violins tell you that the dancing has begun again with increased vigour.

SYNOPSIS.—In this piece the well-known air "The Wearin' o' the Green" is used as the basis of a number of variations in which both the Reed and Brass instruments are successively employed. The Theme is followed by a Paraphrase, which in turn gives place to a Solo for Horn and Clarinet. This is succeeded by a Solo for Bassoon, after which the melody is treated as a "Boot Dance," next as an interlude on the Bagpipes, and then as a Chorale. The Piccolo follows with a variation, which is taken up by the Bases, and concluded by the Cornets. A short Andante Paraphrase leads to the concluding movement, in which the air is treated as a popular March, à la Sousa.
