- 42. Horses may occupy stalls during the night at the risk of their owners.
- 43. The sum of 5/- per horse per night will be deducted from the deposit on any horse occupying a Box Stall in the Show Yard for the night, and 2/0 per night for a standing stall.
- 44. Grooms in charge of horses remaining in the Show Yard over-night must be in attendance at 7 o'clock each morning, to clean out the boxes or stalls. If the boxes or stalls are not cleaned before 8 o'clock each morning, a fine of 5/- will be made, and horses occupying box stalls temporarily must be in their proper stall at 8 a.m. under a similar penalty.
- 45. Horses must bear their forehead numbers during the whole time they are within the Show Yard. No horse shall be stabled in any loose box or stall, by day or night, other than that allotted to it, and no box stall must be locked between the hours of 9 a.m. and 6 p.m. on either day of the Show. Any violation of this rule will render the owner hable to forfeit the deposit.
- 46. If any groom be absent from his horse at the time of the adjudication, or when the horse is required for jumping, the horse will be liable to be excluded from competition, and the deposit forfeited.
- 47. No horse will be allowed out of his stall except at the hours mentioned in the Programme. The exercising or examination of any horse on the paths or roadways, or near the Judging Rings, is strictly forbidden, and will render the owner liable to forfeit his deposit.
- 48. Owners of horses are warned that any act of discourtesy or disobedience to the officials on the part of the owner, groom, or rider, will disqualify the horse for adjudication, or for taking a prize, and the owner shall forfeit his deposit. The Show Committee reserves to itself the power to remove any groom or horse from the Show without being liable for compensation.
- 49. If a horse is absent from his stall at any time after 10.30 a.m. on any morning of the Show, unless by order of the

Stewards of the Class, the exhibitor will forfeit his deposit, and any prize or prizes that may have been awarded to him for the animal.

- 50. No placard or notification of any description shall be permitted to be placed over any animal's stall, or circulated in the yard in reference to any animal exhibited, unless with the sanction of the Stewards. An infringement of this rule shall subject the animal to be disqualified from remaining in the Show Yard, and the owner shall forfeit his deposit, if, on the order of a Steward of the Class, or of the Yard, the placard or notification be not immediately taken down or withdrawn.
- 51. Prizes awarded for a mare which has not produced a foal in 1911, but which is certified as being in foal at date of Show, will not be paid until after the birth of the foal, a satisfactory certificate of which will be required.
- 52. The Veterinary Examination of all horses (except horses entered in the Harness Classes or for the Jumping Competition) selected for prizes or commendations shall be compulsory.
 - (a) The Veterinary Surgeons shall write their Certificate on the Official Form, and it is to be limited to the statement sound or unsound, and the ages of the animals as shown by the state of dentition; and such certificate shall be handed by them, signed to the Steward of the Class in attendance. (A copy of this certificate can be obtained by the owners of prize winners on application)
 - (b) In those classes where height is a qualification, the selected horses shall be measured by the Veterinary Surgeon of the Class. Horses shall be measured as shod when exhibited on the first day they compete, and this measurement shall hold good during the Show in all competitions.
 - (c) No stallion shall be rejected as unsound unless suffering from one or other of the following hereditary diseases viz. —Roaring, Whistling, Ringbone, Unsound Feet, Navicular Disease, Spavin, Curb and Cataract. The exhibitor of a stallion passed as sound shall be entitled to a copy of the certificate.

- (d) To entitle Brood Mares to any prize, it will be imperative on the Stewards to have them examined by the Veterinary Surgeon of the Class, and certified free the above hereditary diseases.
- 53. The results of all Veterinary Examinations conducted by the Society shall be regarded as confidential, except as otherwise provided.

APPEAL.

- 53a. Two Veterinary Surgeons will be appointed as Referees who shall also be in attendance in the Veterinary Paddock to examine horses in cases of appeal, as hereafter provided
- (a) If a horse has been pronounced unsound, or disqualified on account of age or height, the owner or his representative may at once, before the Class leaves the Veterinary Paddock, appeal against the finding of the Veterinary Surgeon, by deposit ing fr and his certificate of unsoundness or other disqualification, with a Steward of the Veterinary Paddock who will immediately refer the case to the two Referees to examine the horse, and the finding of the majority of the three Veterinary Surgeons shall be final. A certificate will then be handed to the owner of the horse, or his representative in accordance with the finding.

RULES FOR ENTERING SHEEP.

AND INSTRUCTIONS TO EXHIBITORS.

54. The Stock must be the bona fide property, and the possession of, the parties in whose names they are entered.

55. All Animals for competition must be regularly entered with the Secretary on or before Saturday, June 15th, at Single Fees, or June 22nd at Double Fees, by a Separate Entry for each lot or animal, according to forms to be had on application.

56. Each lot or animal must have a separate ticket of entry into the Show-Yard, which will be forwarded by the Secretary a few days before the Show Day.

57. All Animals will be admitted between the hours of three and six o'clock on Monday, July 8711.

58. All Animals will be permitted to leave the yard at 6 p.m. on Wednesday, roth July, except that Sheep leaving by boat or train will be allowed out at 4 p.m. on the second day of the Show, on application to the Secretary, from whom a Pass must be obtained.

59. One servant or caretaker will only be admitted in charge of each lot or animal, and must continue in attendance, subject to the orders of the Stewards and Secretaries.

60. All Sheep exhibited must have been really and fairly shorn bare after the 1st of March, 1912, and the date of such shearing must form part of the notice of entry when the animal is in possession of exhibitor before the last day of entry.

6x. It shall be competent for the Managing Committee or Hon. Secretaries to require the exhibitor, or person in charge of each lot, to confirm and verify the notice in the presence of a Magistrate.

62. A competitor may show more than one lot or animal in any class, but not more than five lots.

63. No Second or Third Prize will be awarded unless there are three entries in each class from two different exhibitors.

64. Prizes shall be withheld where there is no merit to justify their award, especially where there is no competition.

65. In all cases of objections to the awards of the Judges, the decision of the Show committee is to be considered final.

66. Any exhibits which, in the opinion of the Judges, or of the Veterinary Surgeon, have been oiled or coloured, vill be disqualified.

67. All exhibits in the open classes must be entered or eligible for entry in the Flock Book of the breed.

Instructions to Judges and Stewards

68. The Judges, accompanied by the Stewards, will proceed at 10.30 on Tuesday and Wednesday mornings to adjudicate on the Classes.

69. Each of the Judges will be provided with a book specifying the Classes to be adjudicated on, the age, and the numbers of the Exhibits, without the names of the Exhibitors, and they are particularly requested not to apply for any further information respecting exhibits under their adjudication or examination. The judges are instructed to adhere to the conditions stated in the Prize List, and not to award or recommend any Prizes save to those therein mentioned.

70. If an Exhibit does not, in the opinion of the Judges, come within the Regulations, they are requested to report the case to the Steward of the Class.

N.B.—A Horse up to a greater or less weight than that specified for the class is to be excluded by the Judges from competition.

71. The Judges are particularly requested to return as "Reserved" in order of merit one or more Horses in each Class which they consider next in merit to those for which the prizes have been awarded; and they are at liberty, should they see fit, to distinguish other meritorious horses by returning them as "Very Highly Commended," "Highly Commended," or "Commended."

72. The Judges are requested to select such Horses in each Class for Veterinary Examination as they may consider eligible for Prizes, or Commendation, but are not to determine the order of merit of such Horses, until they receive the report of the Veterinary Surgeon's examination.

73. The Judges shall not award a prize in any Class where sufficient merit does not appear.



74. No person except a Steward, Judge, Veterinary Surgeon, or person in charge of an animal, shall enter the space enclosed for the Adjudication; nor shall any person hold any communication with a Judge or Veterinary Surgeon, engaged in an Adjudication without permission of a Steward of the Class.

75. No Veterinary Surgeon will be allowed to examine a Horse in connection with the adjudication, except by the direction of one of the Stewards of the Class.

76. The Stewards are particularly requested, as soon as the Prizes have been definitely awarded, to distribute the Rosettes and see the Prize Cards affixed.

77. The Judges are to transmit, under cover, to the Secretary immediately after the Show, their Reports on the several Classes on which they have adjudicated.
