SCHEME C.—FILLIES.

Offered by the Hunters' Improvement and Light National Horse Breeding Society.

SILVER MEDAL, or the Sum of £1.

For the Best Hunter Filly (by a Thoroughbred Horse or Registered Hunter Sire), not exceeding three years old (foaled in 1910, 1911 or 1912), and not having previously won the Society's Silver Medal as a Filly in 1913, which, if unregistered, must be registered within a month of the award for a number in the Hunter Stud Book, possessing a certificate of soundness-from hereditary disease signed by the local Society's appointed Veterinary Inspector (who must be a Member of the Royal College of Veterinary Surgeons) after his examination on the Show Ground.

Prize-winners only will be eligible for the Medal; Reserves and lower awards debarred.

Breeder's Prize—The sum of £1 will be also awarded to the Breeder of the winning Filly.

In each of these classes the first-prize lot stood well ahead, and to produce such blooms the cultural details must have been well-nigh perfect.

Hybrid perpetual roses were good and big entries, nearly all possessing good substance, with nice colours, and few faults in even the losing lots.

Hybrid tea roses were also nice in substance and colours, with no artificial aids, such as one finds at times in the shape of wire bindings to the bud.

Zenal geraniums did not fill to the entries, but the lot which was staged was well warthy of a first prize.

Antirrhinums were fairly good.

I found no pansies or violes in the open classes, which, I am sure, could have been easily filled, if scheduled.

The amateur section failed to fill its entries, but if the exhibitors who came forward were repdesentative of the bulk who remained away, some good stuff has been grown in Cork.

The class for twelve roses had a rare second prize exhibit, which, by reason of one really bad bloom, only had to give way to a uniform lot of commoner varieties, from a rosarian's point of view.

Sweet peas in the amateur's section were of a different calibre to the open, but the varieties and colours were nice.

Stocks and pansies, as staged, were of

good quality.

The baskets of flowers brought out a first prize of beautiful roses, artistically set up.

Strawberries were quite good, the first prize lot being firm and ripe and well-coloured fruits. The next three lots had their positions decided by minor faults

Cork's horticultural potentialities are great enough to justify a strong attempt at an educational exhibition, and, if not deviating too much from the report you have asked me to give, I may state that I am aware that the shows of the past were large and representative, and not apparently taken advantage of. Still, I think the good seed sown has been taken advantage of, and the results are quite apparent (if isolated examples only) in the class of produce which cottagers stage at some of the agricultural shows I have judged at.

Take the two instances where cottagers made an exhibit at the County Council stand. I think any unpreindiced person will admit these examples as healthy and originated by some object lesson received at a show.

I have marked the advances made by two cottagers for the past four years at a local show in the county, and it is a pleasure to note the vigorous strides towards excellence made by these individuals each succeeding year.
