Annual General Meeting.

Annual General Meeting of the Members of the Society held at the Commercial Buildings, South Mall, Cork, on Saturday, 31st January, 1942. Through the unavoidable absence of the President (Mr. E. J. Clarke) Mr. N. Hayes was moved to the chair, also present Professor G. Boyle, Messrs N. Hayes, J. Dely, M. R. C. V. S., T. O'Driscoll, J. Lynch, T. O'Sullivan, A. H. Moore, C. Donovan, C. V. Good, T. The Minutes of the last Annual General Meeting were read and signed.

Mr. N. Hayes was moved to the chair, on the motion of Mr. A. H. Moore, seconded by Mr. T. O'Sullivan.

Annual Report.

The Secretary read the Annual Report for the year, in which he stated that for the first time in 20 years they were unable to hold their Annual Summer Show, owing to an outbreak of Foot & Mouth Disease and the unsettled conditions of the times. The report also dealt with other activities of the Society during the year. Dealing with the financial position of the Society, the report stated that their loss for the year amounted to £430. 0. 11.

The Chairman, in his address, stated that the Spring Show had left a nett profit of £222 against £274 for the previous year. Expenditure, in the Annual General Account for 1941, amounted to £1,894. 19. 2, as compared with £2,499. 19. 4 for the previous year. Subscriptions last year amounted to £432 against £604 for the previous year, and, on the motion of the Chairman (Mr. N. Hayes), seconded by Mr. W. L. Kelleher, the report and statement of accounts were adopted.

Election of President.

Election of President.:- Mr. O'Sullivan, in proposing the re-election of Mr. E. J. Clarke as President for the coming year, said they were very fortunate in having such an ideal President as Mr. Clarke. Having paid a glowing tribute to Mr. Clarke's work for the Society, Mr. O'Sullivan said it was with the greatest pleasure that he proposed his re-election. Mr. Dely, M. R. C. V. S., seconded. The Chairman declared Mr. Clarke re-elected unanimously, amidst applause.

Hon. Secretary elected.

Mr. A. Morrison stated that he regretted very much, owing to health reasons, he was unable to go forward as Honorary Secretary and resigned after 24 years' service. He (Mr. Morrison) said he would like to take the opportunity of thanking all the members and the various Committees for the co-operation he had received during his period of office, and he proposed that Mr. A. H. Moore be elected as Hon. Secretary. This was seconded by Mr. F. G. Hayes and passed unanimously.

In thanking the Members for his election as Hon. Secretary, Mr. Moore paid tribute to Mr. Morrison and said that he regretted Mr. Morrison had to go out after such a long period of office.
