Discussion regarding advisability of holding Summer Show.

A discussion took place regarding the advisability of holding the Summer Show. The Show Committee recommended that a one-day Show should be held, and the dates submitted for the Committee's approval were:— 16th June; 24th June; 29th June. After a long discussion, it was agreed, on the motion of Mr. P.J. Heiliden, seconded by Mr. A.H. Good, M.A., to hold the Show. The question of a date having been discussed, it was decided, on the motion of Mr. D. Cronin, seconded by Mr. N. Hayes, to fix the 16th June provisionally. In the event of the general election for the Dail being fixed for this date, it was agreed that the Show Committee should meet to fix a suitable date to hold the Show.

Additional Class
Horse Section StProvisional Classification.

A provisional classification, consisting of classes for Horses, Ponies, Jumping Competitions, Driving Competitions and Cattle, was submitted for the Committee's approval. A discussion then took place regarding the advisability of leaving the class in for Brood Mares, the Committee being of opinion that the premiums offered by the Royal Dublin Society for these Mares would be sufficient. Eventually it was agreed to leave the class stand. With regard to the Young Horses likely to make Hunters, also the Hunters to be ridden, Mr. A. Mullins said he did not see the necessity of having such classes, as the purpose of having such classes at the various Shows held by the Society in previous years was to help exhibitors and breeders to dispose of their animals. The majority of the members present felt that such classes would be desirable, and it was agreed, on the motion of Mr. N. Hayes, seconded by Mr. B.F. Hosford, to allow the classes stand. All the other classes in the classification, except the Cattle classes, were approved of. In the latter case, it was decided that a special Meeting of the Show Committee should be held on Thursday, 29th April, to deal with same, as a communication was expected from the Department before that date regarding the receiving of Grants from the Department in some of the Cattle classes.
