I am in receipt of your letter of the 9th inst. relative to Cork Spring Show & Sale to be held on the 24th and 25th inst, and beg to inform you that exhibits which have been conveyed by Rail to Cork in connection with this event, and which have not been sold or exchanged will, on the return journey by Ordinary main service, be conveyed at Half Rates at Owner's Risk on surrender of the usual certificate signed by the Secretary of the Society. Due to the Emergency all cheap fare facilities have been withdrawn.

Railway Facilities in connection with Spring Show.

The Secretary stated that the Royal Dublin Society were given facilities for their Bull Show, which enabled selected applicants of Premium Bulls and exhibitors to travel to their Show at reduced rates on production of a voucher, and these facilities were refused to this Society, in connection with their forthcoming Spring Show. Through Mr. Moore, the Hon. Secretary, the matter had been taken up by the Cork Incorporated Chamber of Commerce. It was decided that a protest should be sent to the Railway Company with reference to this discrimination. Mr. Moore stated that the Council of the Incorporated Chamber of Commerce would again have the matter under consideration, and he suggested that representatives should attend on behalf of the Society, and, on the motion of Mr. T. O'Sullivan, seconded by Mr. D. Cronin, the President, Mr. E. J. Clarke and the Secretary were appointed to attend.
