ROYAL DUBLIN SOCIETY'S PREMIUMS FOR MARES.

The Society offers Five Premiums, each value £12, to Farmers who present a suitable mare (not thoroughbred) 7 years old or under, before a Judge approved by the Society who shall certify that the mare is likely to produce a high-class Hunter.

The Premium will not be payable until a Certificate has been received from a Veterinary Surgeon (also appointed by the Society) that the mare has had a living foal, by a **Licensed Thoroughbred Stallion**, within 12 months from the date of the Show, such stallion to be approved by the Royal Dublin Society. A Certificate by the Stallion owner that the mare has been so covered must be produced to the Judge at the Show.

The Royal Dublin Society must be notified by the Owner immediately a Premium-winning mare foals, so that the necessary Veterinary Inspection may be arranged.

This Scheme is confined to Farmers who are defined as persons deriving their principal means of livelihood from farming. Not more than one Premium will be awarded to any one mare or any one Farmer in any year.

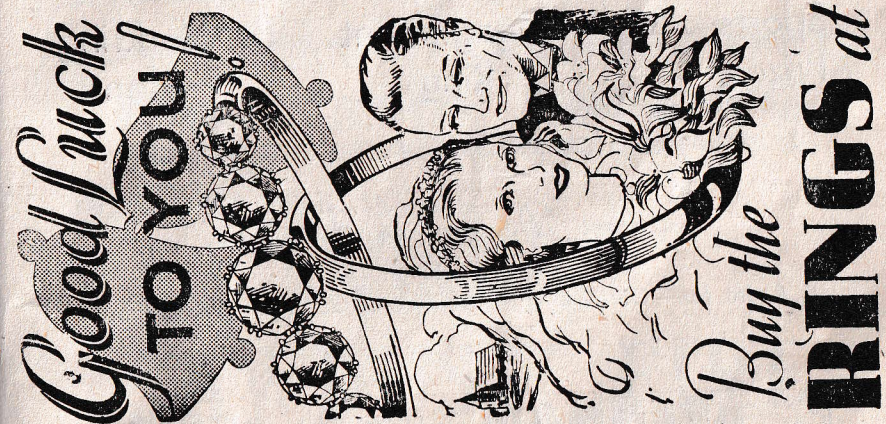

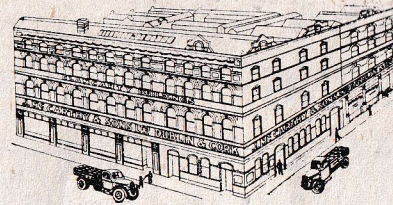

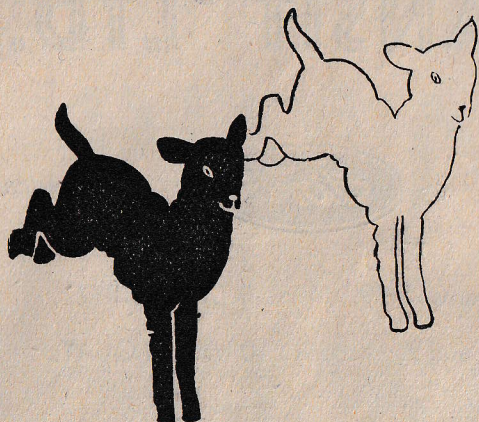
