Judges:- forthcoming Spring Show:-

A letter was read from Mr. J.F. Wright, of Prumplestown, Kildare, regretting that he could not act as Judge of Shorthorns at the forthcoming Spring Show, and a letter was read from the Irish Hereford Breeders' Association, nominating Major Furdon, of Killycuan, Co. Westmeath; Mr. H.J. Potterton, of Carbury, Co. Kildare; and Mr. John Kealy, of Hovseleap, Co. Westmeath, from which one could be selected to act as Judge of Herefords at the forthcoming Show, and it was decided that Mr. H.J. Potterton be invited.

It was further agreed to invite Mr. E.E. Wright to act as Judge of Shorthorns at the forthcoming Spring Show, and, failing him, to ask Mr. Harry Carty, of Wexford.

Aberdeen-Angus:- Mr. T.P. Murphy, of Castleview, Macroom,
Second choice:- Mr. R.C. Williams, of Coolcower, Macroom.

The Stewards who acted at last year's Spring Show & Sale of Bulls were unanimously re-appointed at the forthcoming Spring Show & Sale.

With regard to the Vet Catering arrangements at this Show, it was agreed to leave this in the hands of the Secretary.

Application by Major T.P. Morgan re Sale Class:-

The Secretary stated that a verbal application had been made by Major T.P. Morgan, of Kilmagleary, Carrigaline, asking permission to be allowed bring in a Hereford Bull for sale, for which no class was provided. In reply to a question, the Secretary stated that a Class was provided at previous Spring Shows of the Society for Pure-bred bulls, for which no classes were provided at the Show, and which were intended for sale only, but that this class had to be cancelled, owing to lack of entries this year. After discussing the matter, it was agreed that permission be given to Major Morgan to bring in his bull, and that, should there be further applications, the Secretary was directed to authorise these also, before going to Press with the catalogue.

Stallion Classes:-

Due to cancellation of the classes for Stallions - due to only two entries having been received (one for thoroughbreds and one for Heavy-weight Horses) - an application was received from Mr. S. Kingston, of Pountainstown, asking the Committee's permission to be allowed bring a Stallion into the Show for the purpose of exhibition only. Arising out of this, Mr. M. D. Hesford stated that, in box stall accommodation could be made available, it may be an attraction for persons to come to the Show if there was an exhibition of Stallions. The Committee favouring this suggestion, after discussing same, the Secretary was instructed to insert a notice in the "Cork Examiner" inviting Stallion Owners to bring their horses into the Show for exhibition, or for advertising purposes only, and that the Society would provide box stalls, together with Hay & Straw, at a cost of 2l. 0. 0. per Stallion. This decision would permit Mr. S. Kingston to bring in his horse to the Show Yard.
