be altered to read:-

" The minimum subscription to the Society is £1, except for lady members, for whom the minimum subscription is 10/-. All subscriptions are due on the 1st January each year. Members proposed and elected after the Society's Summer Show shall not be liable for any subscription until the following year. "

and, on the motion of Mr. N. Hayes, seconded by Mr. A. Mullins, the recommendation was unanimously adopted.

Mr. C. MacDonald proposed, and Mr. A. Mullins seconded, that we should co-opt the Chairman, or some other member of each of the other Show Societies from other Counties, which were not already represented on the General Committee. This was referred to the Finance Committee.

Mr. W. McLernon suggested that the Ponies entered for the Children's classes at the Summer Show should be measured by the Veterinary Surgeon in an open place, and not behind closed doors. He (Mr. McLernon) also suggested that the judging of the Ponies should be carried out in some portion of the Show Grounds where they could be judged properly, as, at 1947 Summer Show, they were up to their hocks in mud. This matter was referred to the Show Committee.

Arising out of a complaint by Messrs C. MacDonald and E.H.D. Walker, re not having received their notices of this Meeting in time, Mr. C. MacDonald asked if there was any statutory rule of the Society as to when notices, summoning members to the Annual General Meeting should be sent out, Mr. MacDonald, being informed that there was no such rule, proposed that - in future - notices calling the annual general meeting of members should be sent seven clear days before the meeting. This was seconded by Mr. E.H.D. Walker.

The President stated that there were many difficulties in the way of carrying out this rule, as it very often happened that the Meeting of the General Committee of the Society, at which Meeting the members retired from that Committee, took place only one week previous to the Annual General Meeting, when it would be impossible for notices to be printed and sent out seven clear days before such Meeting. After a further discussion, the matter was referred to the Finance Committee.

On the motion of Mr. P.J. O'Connell, a vote of thanks was passed to Mrs. T.B. Tuckey and her helpers for their work in connection with the catering arrangements at the various Shows of the Society during the year, and, on the motion of Mr. N. Hayes, seconded by Mr. M. Ryan, a vote of thanks was passed to the Commercial Buildings Co. for the use of their room, the Proposer stating that it would be the last occasion on which the Society would have the privilege of holding their Annual Meeting in this room, as the Buildings were about to change ownership, being absorbed by the Imperial Hotel, Cork.
