Read Resolutions forwarded by United Irish Cattle Trade Association, Dublin, with reference to promoting and encouraging the better breeding of Cattle throughout the country, and proposals with reference to prizes to be offered in connection therewith.
The consideration of the subject was postponed to Monthly Meeting, August 7th.

Read letter of 17th July from Mr. James Mac Kuzie with reference to holding an Exhibition of Sheaf Binders & Selfraking Reapers. The question having been discussed, it was, on the motion of Mr. J. P. Fitzgerald Decided that the question of Sheaf-binding Reapers was not of sufficient importance to this district to justify the Society in expending its funds on an exhibition of them.

Read Report of Sub-Committee with reference to holding of a Dairy Conference at Cork in 1887.

The report advised the holding of the Conference, but as the funds of the Society would not permit of the Committee undertaking the expenses in connection therewith they suggested that a Public Meeting should be held, and sufficient funds raised to meet the expenses of the Conference. A Committee to be formed partly from the Agricultural Society and partly from the Public Meeting to carry out the scheme.

The consideration of the Report was after a long discussion postponed until Monthly Meeting 7th August.
